Nursing Careers

Title	Job Duties	
Certified Nurse Assistant (CNA)	Provide basic care for patients (turning, moving, grooming, feeding). Supervised by nurses and doctors.	
Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN)	Provide medical care for patients (taking vital signs, administering medication). Supervised by nurses and doctors.	
Registered Nurse (RN)	Provide wide range of care (take vital signs, medical information, administer medicine, first aid, and more). Decision-making responsibilities.	
Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS)	Provide specialized care. Collaborate with other health care professionals. Evaluate quality and effectiveness of nursing practice.	
Nurse Practitioner (NP)	Develop treatment plans. Analyze and interpret patient histories and symptoms to develop diagnoses, and more.	

Scope of Practice

One of the biggest differences among each of the "levels" of nursing careers is the scope of practice. This describes the services and tasks that a health professional is permitted to provide, in keeping with the terms of their professional license. It is the who, what, where, when, and why of what nursing professionals can and cannot do.

Nursing Program Entrance Exams

Before entering a nursing program, potential students are typically required to take entrance exams. The specific entrance exam you take will depend on the program and will be specified in the admission or application requirements. These are some of the most common:

- TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills)
- HESI A2 (Health Education Systems, Inc. Admission Assessment)
- NET (Nursing Education Test)
- NLN PAX (National League for Nursing Pre-Admission Exam)
