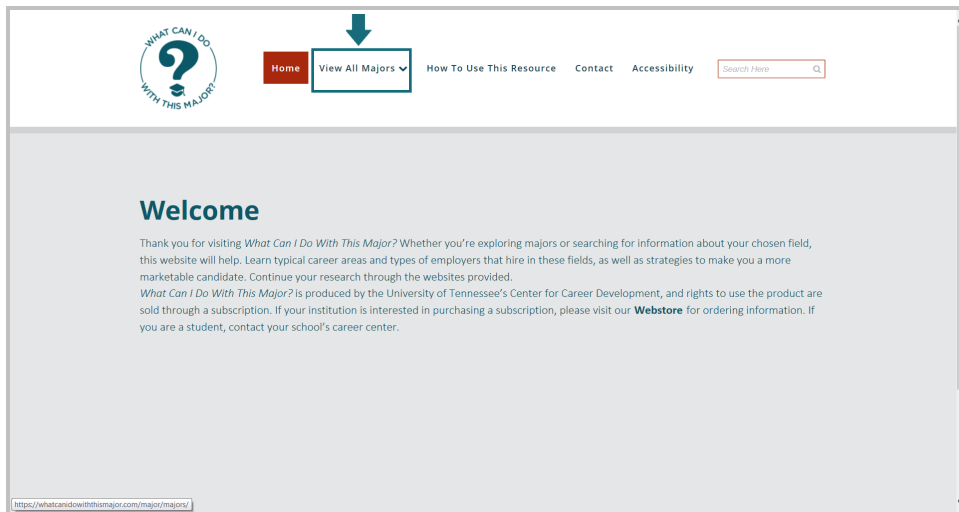

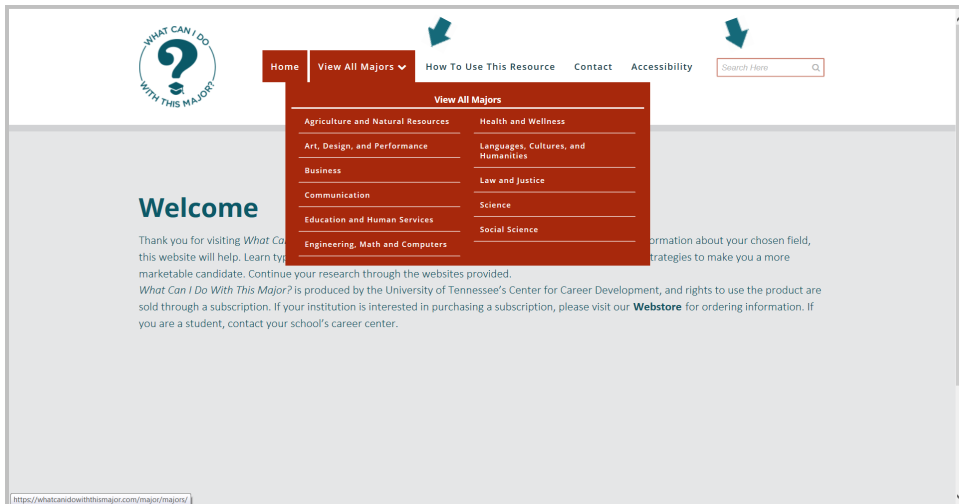
Step 1
